

Animosity Among the Craftsmen

Animosity: noun: a strong feeling of dislike or hatred; ill will or resentment tending toward passive / aggressive hostility: an antagonistic attitude.

Because of human weakness and propensity to misunderstanding, even a passing unkind word or a small thoughtless act can lead to serious consequences in personal relationships. Therefore much vigilance is required to sustain good will between Brothers, and where trust is compromised, much care is needed to make things right. The enemies of healthy human relationships are ignorance, insensitivity, selfishness, evil desires, arrogance and blind pride. Such dispositions degrade human life and cause untold suffering and pain. They produce all sorts of misunderstandings, conflicts, antagonisms and bitterness between people.

Know the difference between annoyance, temper, losing one's temper, and lapsing into rancor. With this knowledge be prepared ahead of time. Make it a matter of spiritual strategy to cut off the process of conflict at the start. Stand back, take a deep breath, think before you speak or act, and have alternative ways of responding to situations when sparks are ready to fly. Do not allow annoyance to turn into anger and anger into rancor. *"When a passion arises, when it is young and feeble, cut it off, lest it stiffen and cause you a great deal of trouble. It is one thing to pluck out a small weed and quite another thing to uproot a great tree."*

Each of us can think of positive ways of responding to provocations. Sometimes it is best to keep silence and take up the matter at a more opportune time. A Brother can speak softly and ask questions of clarification, or a Brother can humbly excuse themselves. We can let the moment pass and at another time address an offender with patient words. There are ways to find the right words and speak with the right tone of voice to keep the fire from flaring up with the risk of consuming those involved.

Psalm 7:5, "If I have paid back evil for evil, let me fall down defenseless before my enemies." To commit evil for evil is to work against our own self. The saint explains: "The 'falling' means no longer to have the power to get up. The 'defenseless' means not to have anything good left in us by which we may at length get up again." We are in danger of losing "our capacity for acting virtuously, or power of right action" by wanting to get even.

Vagarious the Ascetic: "The man who prays for his enemies is a man without rancor." Praying for the wellness and salvation of our adversaries provides the surest path to being healed from resentments and to preparing the ground for healing and peace. May the Great Architect of the Universe give us to remember and keep what we have learned, lest it bring us a heavy sentence on the day of judgment.

The act that hurt or offended you might always be with you, but forgiveness can lessen its grip on you and help free you from the control of the person who harmed you. Forgiveness can even lead to feelings of understanding, empathy and compassion for the one who hurt you. Forgiveness doesn't mean forgetting or excusing the harm done to you or making up with the person who caused the harm. Forgiveness brings a kind of peace that helps you go on with life.

It is not for me to force upon you that which I think; it is but for me to encourage you to think.

I want you to know that our Elected Grand Line has been working together to try and plan for opening our Chapters however, that does not appear to be possible! As you all know the Covid 19 numbers continue to grow around our State and while we do have areas that may not have increasing numbers the vast majority do. We did try to find the "light at the end of the tunnel" in May when I advised we would be celebrating Rob Morris and the opening of our Chapters in September however, that light has been extinguished and we are extremely disappointed!! After a lot of praying, careful consideration, and reviewing the input from the Past Grand Matrons and Past Grand Patrons, I am extending the closure of our Chapters! While some have recommended that we extend this closure until the new year begins in January we have seen how guickly things can change and I do have faith that we should be able to resume "normal" live before the holidays! Required observances such as Landmark and Rob Morris will have been missed and Chapters will not be able to hold the required number of meetings per year. All this will be waived for this year. DIRECTIVE NO. 6

To: The Lodges of the 26th and 27th Masonic Districts In consequence of the recent change in the group gathering restrictions in the cities/counties located in the 26th and 27th Masonic Districts due to COVID-19, it becomes necessary for me, as Grand Master, to hereby ORDER AND DIRECT that the Lodges in the 26th and 27th Masonic Districts close effective July 31, 2020. There shall be no Masonic Meetings held in the Lodges, either Business Meetings or Degree Work, until further notice. The Brothers may meet in groups of 10 or less to practice Ritual Work, work on catechism instruction, or to clean or maintain the Lodge Buildings. Brothers may socially communicate via video conferencing or social media as long as the communication does not involve Lodge Business or Ritual Work. All guidelines and recommendations of your local officials must be followed. As a result of these restrictions I have cancelled the Grand Master's Official Visits to both of these Districts to be rescheduled at a later date if possible. It shall be noted that these restrictions ONLY apply to the Lodges 26th and 27th Masonic Districts at this time. Take due notice and govern yourselves accordingly.
