<u>Balloting</u>

Balloting for initiation, Passing, Raising, and membership must be unanimous; but when only one black cube appears, the ballot should be spreadagain to guard against mistakes; but if a black cube appears on the second ballot it is final, as it shall be when two or more black cubes appear on the first ballot. All balloting must be done in a Master Mason Lodge, and at Stated Communications. None but members of the Lodge have a right to ballot, and no member present can be excused from balloting on any question before the Lodge, except by a vote of the Lodge, upon good cause shown; nor can a member be permitted to retire from the Lodge to avoid casting his ballot. A negative vote cannot be withdrawn, and thereby leave a constructive clear ballot, for no Degree can be conferred until after an actual clear ballot. The secrecy of the ballot should never be violated. If a Mason ascertains by accident, or otherwise, how a particular Brother has voted, he has no right to divulge it. As a general rule it is reprehensible for a Brother to proclaim how he voted.

Integrity, as defined by the dictionary, is "the quality of being honest or having strong moral principles." Masons with integrity are generally known to be trustworthy, honest, and kind. This is a quality that Masons should strive for.

Additionally, Masons should also strive to surround themselves with people who have true integrity. Integrity isn't something that can be faked, but there are some ways to tell that someone has <u>real integrity</u> and are not faking it. Observe the following:

1. TAKING RESPONSIBILITY FOR THEIR ACTIONS

Be accountable for your decisions and actions. Accept the consequences of your choices.

2. PUTTING OTHERS' NEEDS ABOVE THEIR OWN

A Mason with true integrity is only interested in doing the right thing and does so without expectation.

3. OFFERING TO HELP OTHERS IN NEED

A Mason with true integrity will be found helping those in need and does so without expectation.

4. GIVING OTHERS THE BENEFIT OF THE DOUBT

A Mason will engage his reasoning mind and will give others the chance to explain themselves and move forward considering those other points of view. He listens to learn, not to respond.

5. CHOOSING HONESTY IN ALL THINGS

Integrity means being honest and accountable. A Mason with true integrity will live this quality every day.

6. SHOWING RESPECT TO EVERYONE

A Mason with true integrity knows that everyone deserves respect and deserves to be treated like a human being.

7. MANIFESTING HUMILITY

A Mason with integrity will be proud of his accomplishments, but they will, at the same time, remain humble. Their actions speak louder than any praise they may shower upon themselves.

8. BEING ABLE TO ADMIT THEY'RE WRONG

A Mason with true integrity has no problem admitting when they are wrong, or when they made a mistake. They are the first to stop, admit their mistakes, and apologize if need be.

9. SHOWING REGULAR RELIABILITY

A person with true integrity will always show up to an obligation. Integrity is all about being the best person you can be, and reliability is part of that.

10. CONVEYING TRUE KINDNESS

A Mason with integrity is kind. He will not say something nice to your face and something cruel to your back.

Integrity is a trait that Masons should strive for and is a path rarely trodden. Masons with true integrity do these things because it is the right thing – not to be praised for their integrity! That is part of the beauty of someone who lives a life of integrity.

6. You're sitting while a brother is working

Almost every lodge has the three or four guys who do all the work. They do the cooking and the dishes. They're the ones who show up with a truck when some one puts out the signal for help. If you're not that guy, and you can't name the three or four guys in your lodge who are, you've probably already tired them out. They're done and have moved on. And that's when a lodge starts dying.

7. You're in the weeds, and you're not asking for help

It may be kind of fun to curse your lazy brethren and seethe when you have cooked for the lodge and done the dishes. You feel you are up to your knees alone in Masonic chores. At this point, do yourself and everyone else a favor by asking for help. Ask, and it shall be given you; seek, and ye shall find; Knock, and the kitchen door shall be opened and others will be ready to come in and help!

8. There's a brother you're not talking to

My mentor, on the day I met him, told me that your Masonic family is like your actual family. You love then all, but that doesn't mean you will always like them all. If there is a brother who is not talking to you or to whom you are not speaking, break the ice by talking to that brother on the level, on the plumb, on the square.

9. You're talking unkindly about a brother who is out of earshot

Gossip is human nature but can be very destructive. Even if you do not start with bad intentions and rationalize that you're being constructive, I caution you to tread lightly. Idle gossip groups holds the door open, letting in his pals: cliquishness, plotting, and disharmony.

10. It never hurts

Let me be clear: all of us do the above things sometimes. I've done all of them, I still do some of them, and between writing and publishing this article I will have done them. No Mason is a perfect ashlar. If this truth hurts, remember a quote attributed to Alexis Carrel, written as if for Masons: "Man cannot remake himself without suffering, for he is both the marble and the sculptor."

10 Signs You're Doing It Wrong

You might like to think you're worthy of this Masonic institution and that you're doing things correctly. Yet, is this really the case? You could have "Grand" in front of every title you've earned in the Craft, and yet your day-to-day fraternal interactions could be poisoning your lodge and brothers. Here are 10 signs that you might be contributing to a downward trajectory in your lodge:

1. You're sitting alone

I myself am an introvert, so I understand the appeal of sitting on a distant couch or in a darkened corner and scrolling the iPhone while the lodge brothers are whooping it up some distance away. Introverts often like to remain quiet and or enjoy the company of one or two close friends, as they might be simply overwhelmed and exhausted by interaction. While understandable, this is nonetheless a disservice to you and your brethren.

2. You're with the same two guys

Avoid the appearance of cliques and cabals. There will always be some who are more than brothers; they're personal friends whose company you enjoy. Yet, don't ignore the other guys, conversing with your own set too deeply or too long. Remember this by-word: "Your brothers are your business, because we're in the business of brotherhood.

3. You come and go without a handshake

Life is busy, and we don't like interruptions going from A to B. Yet Freemasonry is supposed to be an interruption to let you pause, breathe, and take stock of who you are.

4. You give the ol "No Look Pass"

Everyone's done it. You feel the pat on the arm and see a palm out of the corner or your eye. You grab the hand and shake without even breaking the stride of your conversation. The handshake was historical for "I'm not going to kill you right now," and eventually came to signify, "I'm glad you're here, because I trust you." Face your brother, hold your hand out, grip, and look your interlocutor in the eye.

5. You go from meeting to car to home
