




During these trying times of uncertainty and National unrest, it is a blessing to find a moment in time filled with the light and warmth of Brotherly love and fellowship. The other night, I had the honor, indeed, the privilege to participate in an event that was truly history in the making. MWGM, Thomas Turlington, along with several distinguished Brothers of the Fraternity, made a worthy and well recommended gentleman a Master Mason, on site. At first glance, this may not seem particularly special, however, I assure you that is

not the fact.

Nick Hawthorne and I have been friends for several years. We have had numerous intense and enlightening conversations about politics, philosophy and, yes, Masonry. Nick's father was a Mason. Nick had regularly expressed an interest in following his father's footsteps and become a Master Mason himself. As often happens, life intervened and Nick postponed his yearning so as to attend the duties of a responsible husband and father. Nick's journey has not been an easy one. Recently, he was diagnosed with several cancers and it appeared, to him at least, that he would never make his father proud and become a Master Mason. It was at this time that the Great Architect of the Universe intervened.

It was during one of my visits that Nick confided in me a regret that vexed his mind and heart, causing him immense emotional and spiritual anguish; it was too late to become a Master Mason. As we spoke of his intense yearning, tears of repentance flowed down his cheeks, his hands shook with remorse. It occurred to me that it should never be 'too late'.

Inspired by Nick's revelation, motivated by love of my friend, I asked my Brothers if there was a way, we could relieve his troubled mind and heart. Alas, as is often the case with Masons, a worthy Brother revealed that there was a path. Through the determined efforts of several Brothers, the MWGM Thomas Turlington, contingent upon certain qualifications, could and would make Nick a Master Mason, on site. The Brothers of Clearwater Lodge 127 united together and set about the task of fulfilling Nick's dream of becoming a Master Mason. This combined effort and outpouring of love is emblematic of what Masons do. It is a moment in the long history of our Lodge that I shall hold dear within my breast for the rest of my remaining years.

October 22, 2020...the moment had arrived. The house was bursting with family and friends, all of whom were eager to celebrate this remarkable and extraordinary moment of history. I visited with Nick as he prepared for this courageous and extraordinary event. He was nervous and uncertain as to what was soon to transpire. I assured him that there was nothing to fear for he was among men of honor and loving family and friends. His lovely wife and daughter had made preparations for refreshment and accommodation. Exhilaration and love filled this home and the hearts of all in attendance.

MWGM Thomas Turlington was amazing in his making Nick a Master Mason. The reverential silence and respect were deafening as onlookers were enthralled by the MWGM's expressive and humble words. WM Weldon presented Nick his Lamb Skin Apron, tears welled up in many an eye, followed by SD Tindol's presentation of the Lewis Jewel engraved with the name of Nick and his father. I had the honor, indeed the pleasure, of presenting Nick his Masonic Bible, accompanied by a beautiful rendition of the Bible presentation as performed by the MWGM himself. Nick was also presented his Masonic Education manual, the Masonic Monitor, and the Cypher Book from which he will learn his work. He was then presented his Masonic Ring, at which point there was hardly a dry eye in the house.

Afterward, numerous pictures were taken, to commemorate this solemn event, followed by thunderous applause and congratulation. Hugs, kisses, and words of gratitude soon ensued. It was truly a magnificent moment of pride and admiration for Nick, Florida's newest made Master Mason. Congratulations and welcome my friend, my Brother.

A special thankyou to the MWGM and all the Master Masons that made this historic event possible. Clearwater Lodge 127 has demonstrated what we are all about when united in the common cause of friendship and Brotherly love. Let us never forget this gift of unity that Nick has afforded to our Lodge and may we ever remain unified in the cause of the betterment of men and humanity.

Penney's entire business philosophy was based on fairness to the customer. He was determined to provide the best value for the dollar, offer intelligent and helpful service, and charge only enough to make a fair profit. The number of Penney stores jumped from 48 in 1914 to almost 1,400 in 1929. Penney always wanted his stores closed on Sundays, so his employees could go to church.

When the stock market crashed in 1929 he lost nearly \$40 million. Undaunted, he went to work rebuilding, and within three years, he was on his way to success again. Once again, Penney and his chain of stores prospered. He began writing, lecturing, and devoting more and more time to humanitarian projects and philanthropies. In 1940, during a visit to a store in Des Moines, Iowa, he trained a young man named Sam Walton on how to wrap packages with a minimal amount od paper and ribbon.

He died in 1971. The Reverend, Brother, and Dr. Norman Vincent Peale delivered the eulogy at the funeral.

J. C. Penney became a member of Wasatch Lodge in Salt Lake City, in 1911, and later a dual member of Unite Services Lodge in New York. In 1958, he received a Gold Distinguished Service Award fron Royal Arch Masonry and in 1945 became a 33rd Degree Scottish Rite Mason. He typically wore a large Masonic ring showing his pride of being a member.

Brother Penney did not like the word "employee", preferring to treat everyone as a partner, and calling each "an associate." He devoted himself to treating them as he would want to be treated were the situations be reversed. He put the Golden Rule into action and success.

J. C. Penney, Master Mason

In recent months, media accounts have covered the ongoing news related to the filing of bankruptcy of the J. P. Penney stores around the country, which have been in business for more than 118 years. For us, it is a good time to focus on the Mason who was founder of that company.

James Cash Penney was born in 1875 in Hamilton Missouri. His first paying job there was in a general store, where at the age of 20, he worked for \$2.27 a month.

According to a story about him in the August, 1992, Scottish Rite Journal, Brother Penney "was successful because of his basic philosophy in dealing with people and the principle of the Golden Rule, which was ingrained in him as a young boy by his father, a small-town minister."

He later moved to Denver, where his first attempt at business failed when he refused to provide one of the best customers of his meat market with a bottle of whiskey each week as a bribe. Later, while working in a department store in Wyoming, he turned down an offer for twice his pay to run a store for a competitor because he did not want to compete with his old boss.

Penney's real opportunity emerged when he became a partner in a new store in Kemmerer, Wyoming. By 1907, when he was 32 years old, he was a partner in three stores there, and later took another opportunity to become sole owner for \$30,000. He called his enterprises The Goled Rule Stores. His chain of stores grew, and within three years, he had 14 stores.

Because other stores had taken the name The Golden Rule, he changed the name of his chain to the J. C. Penney Company.




